Community Colleges

Schools & Communities First will appear before California voters on the November 2020 election ballot. It is a constitutional amendment to raise an estimated \$12 billion annually for California's K-12 schools, community colleges and local services by closing a long-standing commercial property tax loophole that benefits particular large corporations and multi-nationals, while protecting homeowners and small businesses. Revenues will be allocated based on current property tax formulas: 40% will be directed to education and spent according to the LCFF equity formula, with 89% for K-12 and 11% for community colleges. The other 60% is directed to cities, counties and special districts for public health, fire protection, water infrastructure, safety net and other vital services."
